

The performance highlights of the Department of Heavy Industry for the month of **March, 2013:-**

I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

(a) Order Booking:

The total order receipts in the current financial year up-to March'2013 has reached a level of **Rs. 31,528 Crs.** which include orders worth **Rs. 15,635 Crs.** booked during March, 2013.

Major orders received during the month include:

Power Sector:

- 2x800 MW NTPC Gadarwara (SG&TG Pkgs.)
- 2x660MW, OPGCL, IB Valley (BTG & Electricals)
- 2x660 MW RRVUNL Suratgarh (EPC)
- 2x660 MW DVC Raghunathpur (TG Pkg.)
- 3x660 MW NTPC Nabinagar (SG & ESP Pkg.)

(i) Industry Business Sector:

- Order for Steam Generators from Advanced Technology Vessel Program (ATVP)/ Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Delhi.
- Order for 400/132kV Switchyard at Nabinagar from Northern Power Generation Company Limited (NPGCL), Bihar

(iii) International Operations:

- Order for Transformer Package for Punatsangchhu-II High Energy Physics, Bhutan.
- Order for 2 x 10 MW Kabu Hydroelectric Project (₹ 90.00 Crs.) – First ever order from Burundi. With this, the presence of BHEL has been enhanced to 76 countries outside India.
- Successfully spun 2 x 100 MW Nam Chien Hydro Project - Vietnam.
- Successfully synchronized – Unit-1 of 2 x 30 MW of PT Master of Social Work (MSW) Project Indonesia.

(b) R&D:

BHEL spent around **Rs.1,248 Crs** on R&D initiatives during the year 2012-13 and filed **385 Patents/ Copyrights.**

II NTPC-BHEL Power Projects Private Limited (NBPPPL):

The cumulative turnover of NBPPPL is ` 119 Crore up to March, 2013 in the current financial year.

III Automotive Sector:

An amount of Rs. 8.25 crore has been released from the Automotive Cess Fund for carrying out R&D activities in automotive sector in respect of 5 on-going schemes and 3 new schemes with the constraint of 33% expenditure in the last quarter of 2012-13 imposed by Ministry of Finance. A meeting of IMG on Fuel Policy and Fuel Efficiency to discuss the issues relating to 10% ethanol blending petrol was held on 5.3.2013. A meeting with German delegation was held on 7.3.2013. German delegation requested to extend the validity of JDI with them on automotive sector by 2 years. Their proposal is under process. WP29 was convened in Geneva, Switzerland in which this Department has participated.

A meeting of Sub-group on electric mobility was held on 20.3.2013.

IV Performance of major PSEs

A brief tabular statement on the performance of some of the major CPSEs under the Department of Heavy Industry is enclosed at Annex-I. The production of these companies during **February, 2013** was 2.50% higher as compared to the corresponding period last year.

V As desired vide D.O. 1/81/19/2007-CA-IV dated 24th September, 2007, the compliance status of the decisions taken in the Cabinet and its Committees is being sent to you separately.
