

The performance highlights of the Department of Heavy Industry for the month of October, 2013:-

I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

The total order receipts in the current financial year up-to October, 2013 has reached a level of **Rs. 7,437 Crs.** which include orders worth **Rs. 2,968 Crs.** booked during October, 2013.

III. Automotive Sector:

- (b) Shri Ambuj Sharma, Additional Secretary, HI visited Moscow, Russia to participate in the 2nd Meeting of the India-Russia Working Group on Modernization and Industrial Cooperation from 2-4 October, 2013.
- (c) Meeting of the Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Industry was held on 23rd October, 2013 at 11 a.m. in Parliament House Annexe, New Delhi to present the status of auto sector in the country with special reference to agriculture, earthmoving and construction machinery. The meeting was attended by Shri Ambuj Sharma, Additional Secretary, HI, senior officers of Ministry of Agriculture as well as representatives of industry associations pertaining to auto industry, tractor industry, earthmoving and construction equipment industry and auto component industry.

IV Performance of major PSEs

A brief tabular statement on the performance of some of the major CPSEs under the Department of Heavy Industry is enclosed at Annex-I. The production of these companies upto **September, 2013** was -17.37 % lower as compared to the corresponding period last year.
