

The performance highlights of the Department of Heavy Industry for the month of September, 2011:-

I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

Order booking:

The total order receipts in the current financial year **up-to September, 2011** has reached a level of ` **14,621 crore** which include orders worth ` **8,479 crore** booked during the month. Major orders received during the month include:

❖ Industry business Sector:

❖ *Captive Power:* Order worth ` 327 crore for 72 MW Cogeneration Plant (1xFr 6 FA Gas Turbine Generator) received from KRIBHCO, for Hazira project.

❖ Power Sector:

- ✓ Order worth ` 4,072 crore for 2 x 600 MW from Singareni Collieries Co. Ltd., for Adilabad project in Andhra Pradesh
- ✓ Order worth ` 3,783 crore for 2 x 660 MW from Dainik Bhaskar Power Ltd, for Singrauli project in Madhya Pradesh.

These are the only two orders of coal based BTG package which have been finalized in the country during current financial year since April, 2011 and both have been secured by BHEL.

❖ International Operations:

- ✓ A repeat order from Mombassa Cement Ltd, Kenya for supply of 1400 KW Slip Ring Induction Motor (SRIM)

II NTPC-BHEL Power Projects Private Limited (NBPPPL)

NBPPPL achieved a turnover of ` 17.15 crore during the month of September 2011.

III CCEA in its meeting held on 15.09.2011 approved this Department's proposal for payment of salary, wages and statutory dues to the tune of ` 59.72 crore to 10 sick/loss making CPSEs for a period from 01.01.2011 to 31.03.2011.

IV. Auto Sector

(a) Shri Praful Patel, Minister (HI&PE) led a delegation comprising Shri Ambuj Sharma, Joint Secretary, DHI, Shri S.N. Sharma, OSD to Minister (HI&PE) and Ms. Maushumi Chakravarty, Director (M&C), Minister of Information & Broadcasting to UK & Germany from 13th September 2011 to 17th September 2011 for strengthening the ties and exploring the possible areas for cooperation with the Government of UK and Germany in Automotive Sector and for the inauguration of “IAA India Day 2011” at Frankfurt Germany during 64th IAA Motor Show. Hon’ble M(HI&PE) held meetings with Mr. Phillip Hammond, Minister in charge of Office of Low Emission Vehicles, U.K.; Dr. Peter Ramsauer, Minister of Transport, Building & Urban Affairs, Germany and Mr. P. Roesler, Minister for Economy & Technology, Germany during the above visit.

(b) A meeting of the Expenditure Finance Committee (EFC) was held on 13.9.2011 in North Block in which the Committee considered the proposal submitted by DHI for setting up of National Automotive Board (NAB).
